

And from now on you should keep me informed and consult me before making any definite step, because as we cooperate we should always make everything in agreement to avoid that you may do things which would counterbalance my negotiations, as I will have the main negotiations in hand.

I have already written to VERLAG STYRIA and also to Dr. Anton Rothbauer by the same mail concerning the statements and royalties.

Under separate cover I am sending you three copies of the Gollancz edition of Born Guilty. Did you receive any British review of this book, if you haven't, I am going to write to Gollancz asking some.
