I am glad to have heard from you and I have read your letter very carefully and I will today start to clear up a few things, while I will wait the return of Mr. Roberto Marchant who has your release from Library Publisher signed by you. When that matter will be settled then everything else can be arranged.


I am surprised that you mention only the publication of your book in Austria and Italy, while I do know that it has been published also in France and therefore please let me know if you have put somebody in charge for that country. If you do not know anything about it, then I will start to find out how the publisher got the contract for the French rights. I would also like to know the conditions for your book in Austria, did you sign in Austria for the German rights or only for the German rights in Austria. It is important for me to know, as this contract was unknown to me, I had sent your book to my correspondant in Germany for the German rights.

My conditions are a commission of 10% for the U.S. and 20% for abroad on all your royalties on all rights. These are the usual conditions for any literary agent.

You will hear from me again pretty soon and I would appreciate if you would send me your other books to be able to start to read them and study the possibilities.
