Dear Mr. Rojas:

We have now made our appointments in Spanish and the total picture of our offerings is becoming somewhat more clear. We have selected from the choices which you have given us the following program for you.

First of all, we should like you to give a seminar in Spanish American literature, including the cuento, for a small group of serious graduate students. This would be for the whole year and would carry three hours credit. We have scheduled it for 11:00 o'clock on Monday, Wednesday and Friday, but there is a possibility that you could arrange with the students to meet them only once a week for about two and a half hours.

Then we should like for you to give a seminar, for advanced undergraduates and some graduate students, on Chilean literature during the fall and winter terms, and the novel of the Mexican revolution during spring term. This is scheduled for 3:00 o'clock on Monday, Wednesday and Friday.

Another course which we would like you to give would deal with the Modernista Movement and is scheduled for 1:00 o'clock, Monday, Wednesday, and Friday. In all of these courses you may feel free to organize the work as you wish. There is of course the problem of books. Perhaps you had better send me a list of the books which you think the students ought to buy for each course and those which the library should have on hand. I think I should order immediately the books which you wish to use for the fall term.

I have read with much interest your excellent article on the two novels and found it most enlightening; however, it does not fall within the province of Comparative Literature, since we normally deal only with studies which cross linguistic frontiers. I am returning the manuscript to you with my renewed thanks for having allowed me to see it.

I look forward to hearing from you again at your earliest convenience. With all good wishes to both of you, I remain
