Dear Mr. Rojas:

I wish to thank you for your letter of August 1 and for the titles of the books which you desire for your classes. I shall order them immediately.

I should have made it a little more clear in my letter of July 22 that the course on the Modernista Movement runs throughout the year and is not limited to the Spring term. The actual courses for which the students will register are as follows:

1. Graduate seminar in Spanish American Literature. Three hours each term at 11 a.m. Monday, Wednesday, Friday.
2. Seminar for advanced undergraduate and graduate students on Chilean literature Fall and Winter terms, and Mexican Novel Spring term. Three hours at 3 p.m. Monday, Wednesday, Friday.
3. Course on Modernista Movement for graduate students. Three hours each term at 1 Monday, Wednesday, Friday.

This makes nine hours each term throughout the year. If there are other books which you wish me to order for the Fall term of the Modernista course, kindly let me know.

Concerning housing, I think it would be much safer if you and Mrs. Rojas were to come in person, and at the earliest possible moment, to find a place to live before the rush season begins. The University maintains a Housing Office which has lists of available places, but they do not send out any addresses. When you come house-hunting, you could go immediately to the Housing Office located in Carson Hall.
