

JUAN PABLO IZQUIERDO

Juan Pablo Izquierdo nació en Santiago de Chile. Luego de terminar sus estudios de Composición en la Universidad de Chile se dirigió a Europa para completar sus estudios de Dirección de orquesta con Hermann Scherchen con quién permaneció durante tres años en Gravesano, Suiza. En 1961 fué nombrado Director del Departamento de Música de la Universidad Católica de Chile en donde organizó y dirigió extensas series de conciertos y óperas, dando especial atención a la música contemporánea. Por su trabajo recibió en 1962 el Premio Nacional de la Crítica. Desde entonces aparece regularmente dirigiendo las orquestas Sinfónica Nacional y Filarmónica de la ciudad de Santiago.

En 1966 obtuvo el Primer Premio en el Concurso Internacional para Directores Dimitri Mitropoulos realizado en Nueva York y siendo contratado como Director Asistente de Leonard Bernstein y la Orquesta Filarmónica de Nueva York. Durante las temporadas 1967-70 fué también Director Residente para ópera y conciertos en la Universidad de Bloomington, Indiana.

Sus primeras actuaciones en Europa fueron en Holanda junto a la orquesta de la Residencia de La Haya en 1969 y desde entonces se intensifica aún más su carrera internacional. Durante la temporada 1976-77 fué Director Titular de la orquesta Gulbenkian de Lisboa. Desde 1974 Izquierdo es el Director del festival Testimonium Israel que se desarrolla en Jerusalen y Tel-Aviv y fué en 1976 que recibió Premio Nacional del Ministerio de la Cultura de Israel por ser considerado el intérprete más destacado de música israelí.

En la actualidad Izquierdo divide su tiempo entre Santiago, en donde es Director Titular de la orquesta Filarmónica y su labor en Europa con residencia en Londres. Ha sido invitado a dirigir las principales orquestas europeas como por ejemplo las de Radio Baviera, Hamburgo,

Frankfurt, Berlin, Sinfónica de Viena, orquestas Filarmónica y Nacional de Francia, Radio Leipzig, Filarmónica de Dresden, Filarmónica de Varsovia, Radio Bruselas, Ensemble Intercontemporain, (PARIS) entre otras.

Juan Pablo Izquierdo was born in Santiago-Chile. After finishing his Education on Composition at The University of Chile, he traveled to Europe to complete his Education on Orchestra Conduction with Hermann Scherchen with who he stayed with for three years in Gravesano, Switzerland. In 1961 was named Director of the Music Department of the Catholic University of Chile where he organized and conducted an extensive series of concerts and operas, giving special attention to Contemporary Music. Because of his work in 1962 he received The Critics National Award. Since then he regularly appears conducting the Symphonic National Orchestra and the Philharmonic of Santiago.

In 1966 obtained the First International Award for Conductors Dimitry Mitropoulos realized in New York and being appointed as Assistant Director of Leonard Bernstein and the Philharmonic Orchestra of New York. During 1967-70 Season was also the Resident Director for opera and concerts of The University of Bloomington, Indiana.

His first appearance in Europe was in Holland with the Orchestra of the Residency of The Hague in 1969 and since then his international career was even more intensified. During the 1976-77 Season became the Music Director of the Gutbenkian of Lisboa. Since 1974 Izquierdo has been the Director of the Israel Testimonium Festival that takes place in Jerusalem and Tel-Aviv, and in 1976 received the National Award of The Cultural Ministry of Israel for being considered the most outstanding interpreter of Israely Music.

Actually Izquierdo divides his time between Santiago where he is The Music Director of The Philharmonic Orchestra, and his work in Europe with residency in London. He has been invited to conduct the principal Orchestras in Europe, such as Baviera Radio, Hamburg, Frankfurt, Berlin, Viena Symphonic, Philharmonic Orchestras and National of France, Leipzig, Dresden Philharmonic, Warsaw Philharmonic, Brussels, Ensemble Intercontemporain, The BBC Orchestra Glasgow, National Orchestra of Spain, and The Holland Radio for the 1985 Holland Festival. During many occasions he has directed The Jerusalem Symphony Orchestra and also The Israel Chamber Orchestra.
